

FACTS WHAT DOES HICKORY POINT BANK DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.	
What?	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Social Security number ● Income ● Account balances ● Payment history ● Credit history ● Credit scores <p>When you are <i>no longer</i> our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.</p>	
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons Hickory Point Bank chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Who is providing this notice?	Hickory Point Bank means Hickory Point Bank and Trust.
What We Do	
How does Hickory Point Bank protect my personal information?	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings. We educate our employees about the importance of confidentiality and customer privacy and we restrict employee access based on need.
How does Hickory Point Bank collect my personal information?	We collect your personal information, for example, when you <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Open an account ● Deposit money ● Apply for a loan ● Pay us by check ● Show your government-issued ID We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.
Why can't I limit all sharing?	Federal law gives you the right to limit only <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes - information about your creditworthiness ● affiliates from using your information to market to you ● sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing. See below for more on your rights under state law.
Definitions	
Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and non-financial companies. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● <i>Hickory Point Bank does not share with our affiliates.</i>
Nonaffiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and non-financial companies. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● <i>Hickory Point Bank does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.</i>
Joint Marketing	A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● <i>Our joint marketing partners include advertising agencies.</i>
